
Please join us to celebrate the successful completion of the Gippsland Community e-Bus Pilot Project and officially launch the final report.

Colleen Reeves - PBE Real Estate

If there's one person who truly embodies the spirit of Venus Bay, it's Colleen Reeves. Growing up in South Gippsland, Colleen first visited the Bay as a Year 7 student and has been connected to this coastline ever since. She fondly remembers the Venus Bay of the 80s—few fences, wide-open blocks and horses quietly grazing—a place that felt wild and free.

Colleen began her real estate career with PBE in 2003 and jumped at the opportunity to move to the Venus Bay office in 2004. The decision was an easy one: her children were growing up on the coast she loved, and the community already felt like home. In 2013 she became a partner, and in 2022 she proudly took ownership of the business.

What keeps her passionate after all these years? "The coastline is magnificent—clean, wild and ever-changing," Colleen says. "But the best part is seeing the joy on the faces of new holiday-home owners when they pick up their keys. Helping make their dreams a reality never gets old."



Cathy Duvel – About Learning

Another new comer to the area, Cathy Duvel from About Learning moved to Venus Bay in 2021. What drew her to the area was the wild natural beauty of the coastline and the sense of a small village lifestyle.

Cathy is passionate about supporting individual people, groups and teams to become really good at communication that creates psychological safety. She says: "When we demonstrate respect for all and are inclusive of everyone's thinking and contribution; and everyone feels valued and appreciated, extraordinary things start to happen in our relationships, team/group dynamics and overall sense of wellbeing and purpose."

Cathy teaches a body of work called Time To Think and told me the training as a Time To Think facilitator changed her life and how she parented and

related to her sisters especially. It helped her to be her better person. Bringing up three kids is a tough gig at the best of times, and these skills helped her make those teenage years a bit smoother and more connected."

Cathy hosts the Time To Think workshops throughout the summer from her home in Venus Bay and if anyone is interested in honing their communication and interpersonal skills, look out for the posters around the neighbourhood.

NEW Social Cycling Group!




