Sunny 15 months on. We want to hear from you!

We're now 15 months into our 2-year Community Transport Pilot and the project team has learnt a lot. We continue to learn and adapt our services based on community use and your feedback.

We are pleased to announce that based on feedback and a review of usage data we have revised our services and now travel to Wonthaggi more often (Monday weekly) while we will go to Leongatha fortnightly on a Friday.

We have also made V/Line connections more flexible to accommodate you. We will now offer connections to <u>all</u> V/Line services (based on volunteer driver availability) for a donation of \$10pp with a minimum charge of \$40. We will also continue to take groups to community events, festivals and places of interest like the Pear Party in Toora and the Yarram Trashion Parade. Our e-Bus continues to be available for private events for a reasonable donation to the VBCC and we have recently transported wedding parties to both Harman's Wines and Gurney's Cidery.

The Research Project Needs Your Input

The purpose of the <u>pilot project</u> Venus Bay and Sandy Point are participating in is to work with our partners, La Trobe University, the Department of Transport and Planning and iMOVE to develop a final report that can help other communities implement community transport more easily. Magda Szypielewicz, the project researcher from La Trobe University, will be in Venus Bay on 17, 18 & 19 March to conduct focus groups and interviews with both volunteers and the broader community. Your feedback will be a critical part of the final report, so we encourage you to make yourself available.

VENUS BAY COMMUNITY CENTRE SKATE PARK

The fate of the Skate Park behind the Venus Bay Community Centre has been decided by the South Gippsland Shire Council.

This skatepark was created over 25 years ago by young residents who championed the need for a facility in the township. It has been a beloved asset and well used by young and old over many years. By current standards, the skatepark would not be built at that location now – with no passive



oversight and behind a building, it no longer meets recreational standards.

With the redevelopment of Jupiter Park and the creation of the new skate precinct – which is a wonderful asset to Venus Bay – the Shire have made the decision to demolish the skate park and undertake landscaping work to create a different space behind the Community Centre.

Their budget for the landscaping work is only current until end of this financial year – so this will be done before June 2025.

So many people have learned to skate, or scoot or ride in this park – and it's been a site for holiday program activities with street art painting by local kids. It has a rich history and a great story. The Shire are keen to erect an acknowledgment plate/panel once works have been finished to demonstrate the legacy of this site – if you have photos or memories, please send them to info@vbcc.org.au

Preserving Venus Bay's Storied Cultural Heritage



Sonia Weston is a local Cultural Heritage Officer. And last Saturday, after receiving much response and interest from our community to gain more information of the local history she generously spent time sharing her knowledge. We all met at the Artcube site and on that hot morning sat under the two Banksias as Sonia, equipped with artifacts told us stories of the rich tapestry of Indigenous cultural heritage of this area.

She detailed the prevalence of coastal flint, a material harvested from the ocean floor and used by her ancestors for tools and fire-making. "You find it a lot down here and over at flat rocks, as well as flint material. The ancestors used the

stone tools to light fires," she explained. These artifacts were traded across the region, with evidence found as far as Clyde North and Cranbourne.

Sonia showed other remarkable discoveries, including petrified wood, an intact wooden coolamon from Cape Paterson and grinding stones which bore ochre scars – indicating they were used for ceremonial use. She also had many samples of green stone from different places such as Mt William and Kitty Miller Bay and explained the different properties they held and how they might have been used by the way they had been shaped to fit into the hand. Also explaining that the green stone from other sites was a good indication of trading activities.

The significance of the artifacts extends beyond their physical form, representing the deep cultural connections that have endured for generations. Sonia emphasised the importance of preserving and respecting these sites, encouraging community members to be vigilant in reporting any discoveries.

She shared how the whole of Venus Bay would have been dunes that people used as living sites - fully protected from the elements. Sonia recounted instances where construction projects have inadvertently disturbed burial sites. Also middens- which are areas where shells and other food remains accumulate. Middens are evidence of living sites and often indicate a ceremonial site.

For Sonia and the wider Indigenous community, the preservation of Venus Bay's cultural heritage is not just a matter of historical significance, but a deeply personal and spiritual connection to the land. She encourages residents to be mindful of their surroundings, to report any discoveries, and to participate in cultural events and ceremonies that honour the area's rich history.

As development continues to shape the landscape of Venus Bay, the community's commitment to safeguarding its cultural heritage remains steadfast. Through education, collaboration, and a deep respect for the land, the stories of this remarkable place will continue to be told, preserving the legacy for generations to come.

Sonia's suggestion of a future cleansing ceremony for the community to honor the cultural heritage of Venus Bay was well received. Keep an eye out for Sonia's posts in the future.



In the face of community distress and horror about recent wildlife kills in Venus Bay, Tarwin Lower and Walkerville – here's a more positive message from Tarwin Landcare Group to change the focus:

Yes, it's been a bad week for wombats of late – but let's not waste energy on three or four sad and sick individuals.

Instead let's celebrate the wonderful things that our community does for wildlife and also ask what can we do to reduce accidental road strike.

- Great work Sue Moore, Kylie Laing, Sally Bluett Boyd and other amazing wildlife carers. I don't know how you can do what you do without falling apart.
- Great work Sue Flere and other carers who find and treat Wombat Mange
- Great work Mark Radley. Your signage has been a huge wake up call for a lot of people. Anecdotal evidence suggests that accidental roadkill has reduced since you began your publicity campaign. Please keep it up.
- Thank you to everyone who creates safe places in their gardens and on their properties for wildlife. Bowls of water, plants that provide cover and food, and nesting boxes are just some ways you can create wildlife-friendly back yards.
- Thank you to everyone who thinks before they put out rat or mouse bait. Can you use a non-lethal trap instead, which will protect native rodents like bushrats and antechinus? At the very least, avoid 'second generation' baits that contain brodifacoum which remain in the liver of the animals that eat them and poison any animal that eats them, e.g. goannas, owls, dogs.
- Thank you to all the cat owners who keep their pets inside so they can't kill wildlife.
- Thank you to everyone who keeps their dogs on leashes when out walking. (Dogs are a major killer of koalas; this often occurs in their own backyard, sadly).
- Thank you to everyone who controls feral animals like foxes, rabbits and deer, for giving our native flora and fauna a chance.
- Thank you to everyone who has heeded Mark's call to slow down, particularly at dusk and dawn.

What can we do to help protect our wildlife?

- We can start by asking our wildlife carers what they need and suggest. Should we be advocating for an 80km speed limit at night? What about special wildlife crossings or fencing? (note these type of suggestions need to be backed up with good research.)
- Let's build up the data about where and how many of our native animals are being killed so that we back up any requests to Council, VicRoads and our Politicians. Take a photo on your phone (the metadata should record the location) or make a note of the location – I can provide more information about where to submit the report.

Statement from the Mayor: Offshore Wind

The following statement is from Cr John Schelling, Mayor of South Gippsland Shire Council.

"In response to upcoming offshore wind-related community engagement sessions in South Gippsland, I would like to re-state, in a summarised form, Council's position in relation to offshore wind. This was endorsed by resolution to Council in 2022.

"Council recognises that offshore projects proposed off Gippsland's coast could help meet emission targets and these projects could also offer the local community opportunities and benefits. Benefits could include increased economic activity, investment in our local community and job creation. With this in mind – and considering the federal government's designation of Gippsland as Victoria's first Renewable Energy Zone – Council has provided in principle support to offshore wind.

"There are caveats to this support, however, which include the following:

- "More information is required on the direct and indirect impacts and opportunities that proposed projects located near the South Gippsland coast may have on the South Gippsland community and the position of the community is not yet fully understood.
- "There needs to be a greater understanding of direct community benefits and potential offsets for our community.
- "The coastal and marine environment must be protected and that any proposed developments do not have an adverse impact.
- "Projects must use existing infrastructure and transmission routes, including placing transmission lines underground, to minimise the impacts to existing land use such as farming and tourism.
- "South Gippsland has the greatest number of agricultural businesses of any Victorian municipality and it is vital that our agricultural land is protected.



It's not too late to have you say on what you'd like to see happening in our Shire in future.
