ArtCube Update

Our Current Artist in Residence: Dr Tracie Mitchell

The Thread of an Idea: February 5 – March 6.

Residencies give an artist permission to sit with an idea, to rediscover the importance of play, and to explore without the pressure of producing a resolved work or beginning with a fixed concept.

The current ArtCube residency provides an opportunity for Tracie to further develop a body of work that began during her time at the Venus Bay Community Centre Art Cube Project earlier in the year. There, Tracie spent time exploring free-form hand stitching — a process untethered from traditional embroidery patterns or pre-marked designs.



A significant outcome of that earlier residency has been the inspiration to apply for a new creative initiative in East Gippsland. *NIGHT FROCKS @ ICEWORKS*, presented by FLOAT Creative, will feature artists embellishing vintage garments for exhibition. Tracie has been invited to work with a vintage French linen nightgown, which will form part of an exhibition in Lakes Entrance during the Winter Festival, running from 19 June to 19 July 2026.

To date Tracie has been expanding on the slow stitch concept whilst closely documenting in words, pictures and film the process of working with a vintage garment. Reimagining what the gown might become for the final exhibition – one stitch at a time.

Coming up in the Cube:

March 10 – March 22 - Terrie Thompson

You may remember Terrie from her last exhibition which consisted of a whole pod of whales made from discarded denim. Complete with barnacles and refuse they all had a story about rubbish and it's impact on Ocean life.

Since then, in true artist style, Terrie has been contemplating a whole range of new ideas to extend the life of other commonly discarded textiles. Branching away from denim Terrie will spend her time in the Artcube bringing some of those ideas into being. Drop in to see what those ideas are and how a bit of creative thinking can help extend the life of a piece of fabric.

March 23 – March 29 - Helen Dean

Relatively new to the Venus Bay area Helen was a graphic designer in her previous life.

Helen is making the most of the Artcube being in town to kick off some projects she has been dreaming of and waiting for the 'right' moment to start. Helen is planning on working with some of her favourite garments – too good to throw out, not necessarily suitable to wear anymore.

They have been in the bottom of the wardrobe waiting for her to have the motivation to commence. The Artcube is offering space to explore those ideas and hopefully initiate a new creative practice.



March 30 -April 30 - Kate Stuart

Kate is returning to the Artcube to continue her work on the Tarwin River clays project.

Understanding Solar, Batteries and Rebates: Learning What's Right for Your Home



Choosing solar and battery storage can feel overwhelming. How big a system do you need? Is a battery worth it? What rebates are available?

Through the **Energy Exchange Workshop Series**, our community has been learning these answers together — in practical, accessible ways, and grounded in real local experience, with support from Mycelia Renewables and Venus Bay Community Centre.

Making sense of solar and batteries

A key focus of the workshops was helping households understand **what kind of solar and battery system suits their own home**, rather than pushing one-size-fits-all solutions. Participants explored:

- How much electricity their household actually uses — and *when* they use it
- How roof size, orientation and shading affect solar output
- What battery storage can (and can't) do during outages and peak pricing periods
- How to plan upgrades in stages, starting with solar and adding storage later if it makes sense

By sharing real examples, people could see how different households made different choices — and why.

Navigating rebates and assistance

Rebates and incentives can significantly reduce the cost of solar and batteries, but they are often hard to understand. The workshops broke this down clearly, helping participants:

- Understand what rebates and assistance are currently available
- Learn eligibility basics and common pitfalls
- Compare quotes with confidence and ask the right questions
- Avoid rushed decisions driven by sales pressure

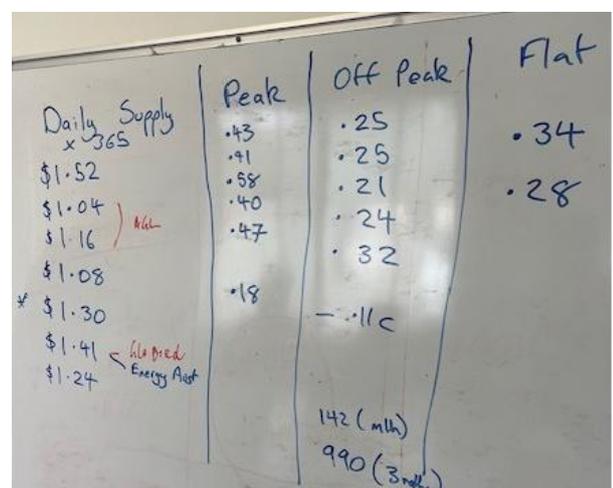
Knowing what support is available — and how to access it — empowered people to take their next step with clarity.

Understanding your energy bill

Understanding your energy bill is essential to choosing the right system. Participants learned how to:

- Read their bill and identify usage patterns
- Understand tariffs, peak pricing and feed-in rates
- See how solar and batteries might change future bills
- Estimate potential savings realistically, based on their own household

This knowledge helped households align system size with real needs, not guesswork.

Learning from each other

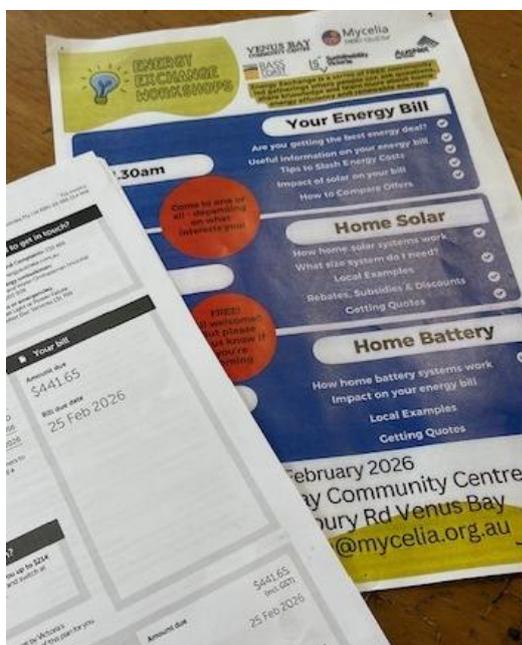

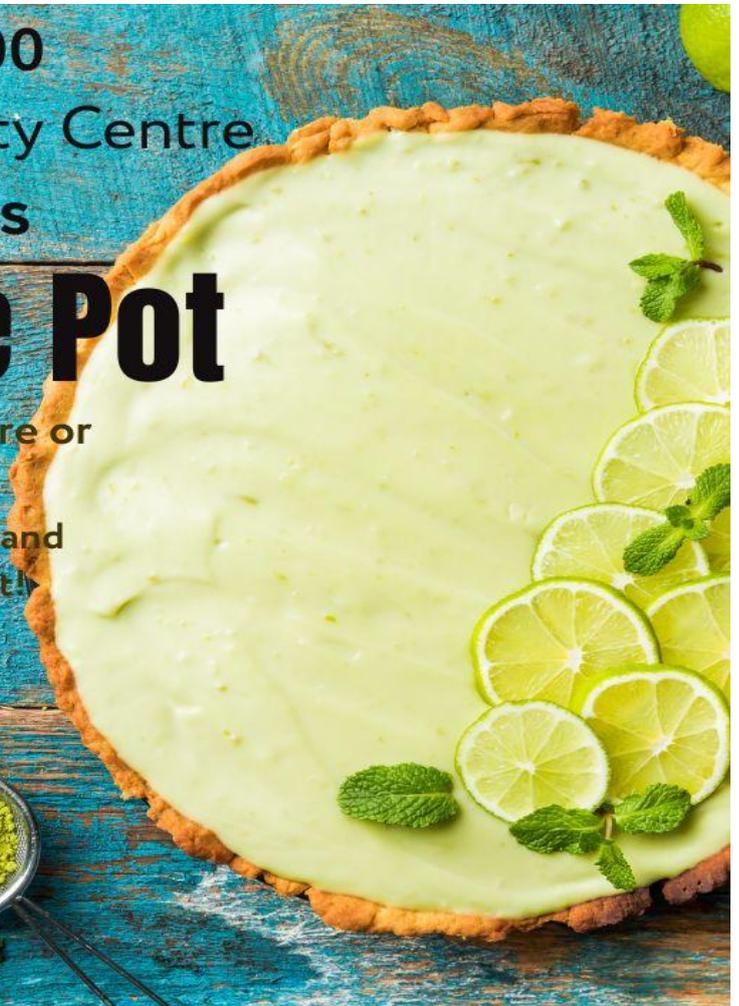

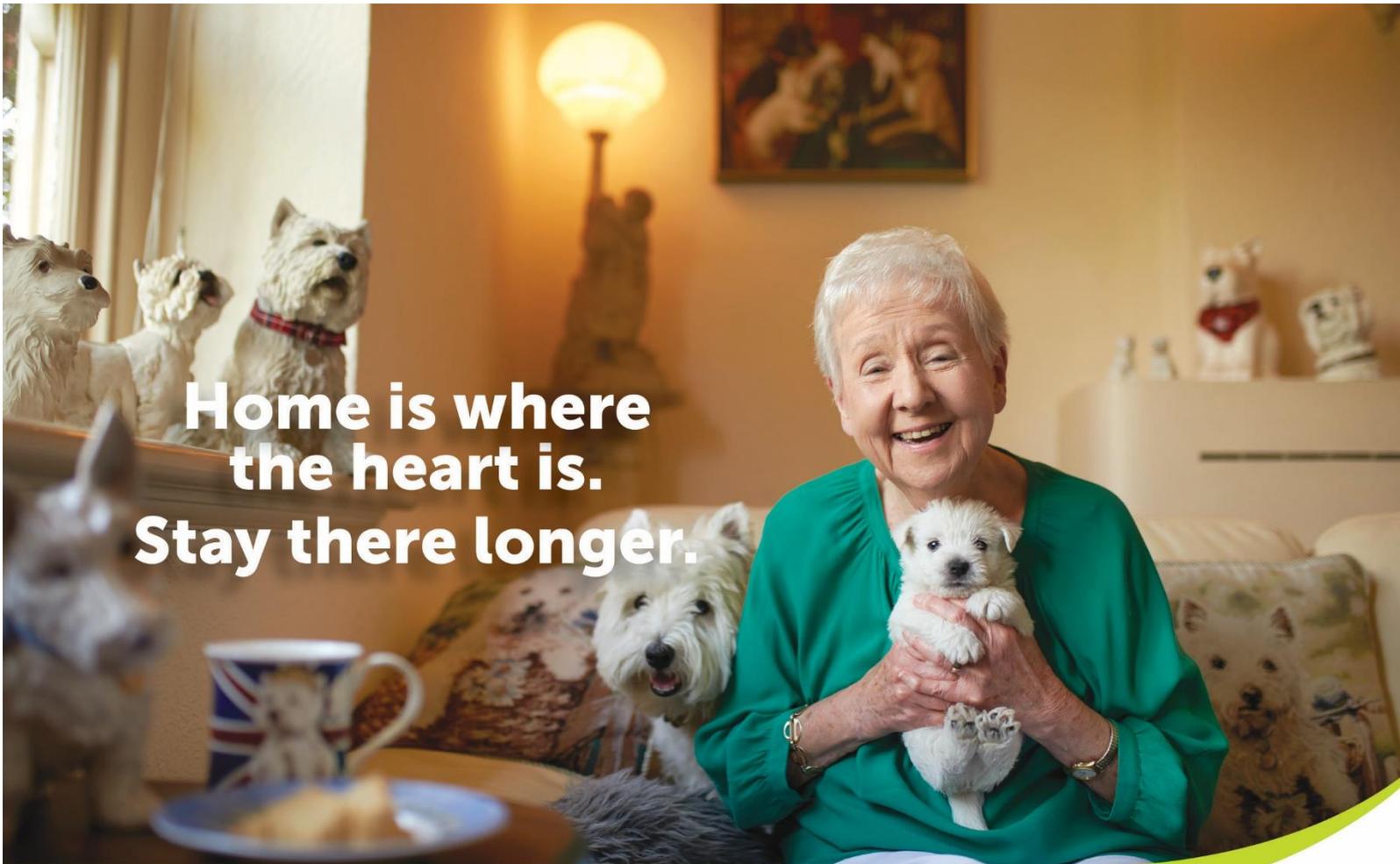
