Feed the People: Growing Food, Skills and Community in 2026

As 2026 begins, an exciting new chapter is unfolding at the Venus Bay Community Centre. With the support of a small Victorian State Government grant, we are launching **Feed the People** — a growing collection of programs and activities designed *with* and *for* our community.

Feed the People builds on the wonderful things already happening locally and aims to expand, connect and strengthen our shared food culture. It's about more than meals — it's about learning together, sharing knowledge, building resilience and deepening community connections.

A key focus of the program is **collaboration**. We'll be working alongside local groups, organisations and community members, using a variety of community spaces and encouraging more people to get involved — whether you're a seasoned grower, a keen cook, or just curious to learn.

Here's a snapshot of what's taking shape:

Growing Together

Our Community Centre garden beds are expanding — and the tomatoes are already thriving! We'll also be working with the Health Centre's existing Grow Your Own Food group, gardens and connecting with other groups and individuals who want to share skills and knowledge about growing food at home.

Seasonal Planting Guide

We're developing an annual seasonal planting guide to support both community gardens and home gardeners, helping everyone grow the right things at the right time.

Workshops & Skill Sharing

Seasonal workshops will cover planting, harvesting, preserving and practical tips and tricks. These sessions are about building confidence, sharing experience and keeping valuable food knowledge alive in our community.

Community Meals, Grown Locally

Our much-loved Wednesday Community Lunches will continue to grow, with a goal of using more homegrown produce and preserves from our Forage project.

NEW Wednesday Evening Meals

Starting in February, we're introducing a **new Wednesday evening meal**, beginning with two nights and expanding as community interest and capacity grow. Best of all — **meals will be free in February**.

Strengthening the Free Food Pantry

We'll also be working with partners to enhance the Free Food Pantry at both the Venus Bay Community Centre and the Tarwin Health Centre, helping ensure good food is accessible to those who need it.


Food Handling Training for Volunteers

To support these growing food programs, we'll also be offering food handling training for volunteers. This ensures meals are prepared and shared safely, while building valuable skills and confidence for community members involved in food activities.

Feed the People is a community effort, and ideas are always welcome. Whether you'd like to volunteer, share knowledge, grow food, cook, or simply take part — there's a place for you.

Help Feed the People: Do you have excess produce in your Garden?

Do you ever find yourself with more zucchini, tomatoes, herbs, or fruit than your household can possibly use? This season, your extra home-grown produce could make a meaningful difference—well beyond harvest time.

We're launching Feed the People, a new community program dedicated to collecting excess, home-grown fruits and vegetables and turning them into fresh food and preserves that can be shared year-round with neighbours in need.

The idea is simple: reduce food waste, increase food access, and strengthen community connections. Surplus produce will be collected and either distributed fresh or used to create shelf-stable preserves—such as jams, sauces, pickles, and other preserved foods—so that nothing goes to waste and support can continue even outside the growing season.

Many of us grow more than we expect. Feed the People offers a safe, organized way to share that abundance. Donated produce will be responsibly handled and processed, with care taken to maximize use and minimize waste, ensuring your garden's bounty reaches families and individuals facing food insecurity throughout the year.

We are currently seeking access to excess produce from local gardeners, backyard growers, and small homesteads who are willing to participate during the growing season. Whether it's a few extra pounds or a bumper harvest, every contribution helps—fresh today and preserved for tomorrow. If you're interested in participating or learning more about how donations and preservation will work, we'd love to hear from you. Together, we can turn surplus into sustenance and help feed the people all year long. ❤️

Sunny Update - Our third year of community transport!

We've now completed the 2-year pilot into community transport and are looking forward to the release of the full final report. It's encouraging to see other small communities like Yarram follow our lead and start looking into how to implement community transport in their community.

Now that the pilot has been completed, funding for the community bus has become our responsibility. We would like to thank Bendigo Community Bank Inverloch for their generous grant as well as everyone who has chipped in by becoming a Friend of Sunny or purchased tickets through our Christmas raffle and fundraiser. We would also like to thank all of our volunteers who have contributed over 550 hours and assisted 1650 passengers in 2025.

The Year Ahead

This year we will continue to offer a regular shopping trip to Wonthaggi while also looking at how we can incorporate regular trips to places where fresh, affordable produce is available to buy or swap. This includes the Leongatha Community Garden's Cluck and Collect (Thursday afternoon), the Fish Creek Summer Market (Sat morning) and the Coal Creek Farmers Market (2nd Sat of each month). To travel we request a \$5 donation per trip or \$20 per month to travel on all scheduled services for the month. Community donations go straight back into keeping Sunny on the road.

We will also be doing some additional trips to places like Wilsons Promontory, the Desal Plant Gardens as well as other community events and celebrations. Sunny is still available for private hire and V/Line connections subject to volunteer availability.

Supporting Our Volunteers

Our services are primarily run by volunteers, so we ask that you follow these basic rules to minimise the impact on our volunteers.

- We are not on call. We check for messages and emails and respond to community enquiries Monday to Friday usually between 8 and 11am, so please be patient.
- Bookings for regular services must be made by 5pm the day prior to the service.
- If you need to cancel a booking please call or text the Duty Manager Phone on 0403 108 199 (messages through the booking platform take up to 24 hours to arrive so not ideal).
- For private bookings we need 3 days to find a volunteer driver, organise donation payments, arrange routes and pick-ups and ensure everything is in place.



Energy Exchange is a series of FREE community-led gatherings where people can ask questions, share knowledge and learn more about home energy efficiency and renewable energy.

Come along to the next series of workshops about Energy – we are hosting 3 different sessions on the one day – **Saturday 21 February** to cater for people at all stages of their energy journey.

We hosted the **Bring in your Bill Day** last year – and it was a great success with people stepping through important information on their energy bill and what to look for when comparing energy companies' rates. By comparing their energy bills with each other, residents identified a gap of 18c per kWh between the highest and lowest rate. It doesn't sound like much but when you multiple 18c by the typical Australian household usage (6,100 kWh) it adds up to hundreds of dollars a year. "I rang OVO (our current provider) this morning and now I'm on the same plan that Graham (who was sitting next to me yesterday) is on. So that has saved us approximately \$200 based on last years usage." Karen, Venus Bay.

Helen, also from Venus Bay, was concerned that despite having solar, her energy bills seemed high. By having knowledgeable people look at her bill, Helen made a phone call to her provider and discovered they didn't have her solar registered. This meant Helen had been missing out on solar credits for six months. "After attending the workshop, I felt stimulated and confident to review my bill and the plan that I was on before reviewing all offers presented on the Vic Gov website and to finally take some action" Helen, Venus Bay.



These Energy Exchange Workshops are delivered by Mycelia Energy Collective and Venus Bay Community Centre, funded by Ausnet Energy Resilience Community Fund, FRRR Community Led Climate Solutions and is part of Community Electrification Engagement program that is delivered by Sustainability Victoria on behalf of the Victorian Government. The aim is to empower community members to get the best energy rates, support home energy efficiencies and households shifting to renewable energy

We know people are interested and ready to think about installing solar and/or a battery system. That's why we are offering practical sessions on identifying what system requirements would suit your lifestyle/home usage and help to navigate what subsidies and credits that might be available.

These workshops are a continuation of the Community Energy Project that was started about 5 years ago – a series of actions and projects that have improved our community energy resilience – here's a snapshot of what we've achieved:

Community Energy in Action – Venus Bay & Tarwin Lower

Over the past five years, the Venus Bay Community Energy Project has delivered practical, community-led initiatives that strengthen local energy resilience, reduce costs, and support a sustainable future – for and with our community.

Building a Centre of Energy Resilience

- Transformed the Venus Bay Community Centre into a resilience hub through:
 - Expanded solar array and battery storage
 - Backup generator and satellite communications
 - Full electrification of the building
- The Centre now operates as a critical community asset during outages and emergencies.

Community Energy Planning & Vision

- Delivered a **Community Resilience and Reliable Energy Feasibility Study** through community-designed workshops.
- Co-created a **Community Energy Plan**, providing a clear roadmap to guide future projects and investment across Venus Bay and Tarwin Lower.

Australia-First Community Electric Transport

- Established the **Gippsland Community Transport Project**, an Australian first.
- Introduced **SUNNY**, our community-owned electric mini-bus, now in its third year of operation. this initiative provides community transport options (using renewable energy and community power!!)
- Collaborative impact through a twin project in Sandy Point with **SANDY**, delivering renewable-powered transport across coastal communities.

Community Battery for Tarwin Lower

- Successfully attracted funding for a **Resilience Community Battery** at the Tarwin Lower Recreation Reserve.
- Project currently underway, with completion expected in **August 2026**.
- The battery will deliver:
 - Improved community resilience
 - Reduced power bills
 - Savings for maintenance and decommissioning
 - Ongoing community benefit

Strategic Partnerships & Investment

- Developed a strong strategic partnership with **Mycelia Renewables**, focused on collaborative, community-centred energy solutions.
- Secured funding to deliver priority actions identified in the Community Energy Action Plan.
- Established productive and enduring partnerships with Changing Weather, Coalition for Community Energy, Federation University, Ethical Fields, iMove Cooperative Research Centre, , La Trobe University, local and industry stakeholders and other community energy networks and projects across Victoria and beyond.

Community Electrification Education

- Partnering with **Gippsland Climate Change Network** and **Mycelia Renewables** to support the delivery of the **Community Electrification Education Program**.

Energy Exchange Workshop Series

- Delivered a series of practical, accessible workshops funded through Mycelia Renewables:
 - **Tune In** – What's driving your energy bills
 - **Switch On** – Easy energy efficiency wins
 - **Plug In, Power Up** – Electrification made easy
 - **Charge Ahead** – Solar, storage, rebates and roadmaps
 - **Make a Connection** – Connecting with local providers and getting answers to take the next step

Community is at the heart of everything we do – and there's always more to accomplish on the community energy journey. Be a part of it – pop into the Centre any time to chat, keep up to date with our newsletter and socials, or let us know what you are interested in or want to be involved with.

ArtCube Update

The Artcube has been occupied by a small group of dedicated painters who have been attending workshops on a regular basis at the Community Centre. Lead by one of the artists the group have exhibited their works and used the time to sit and paint in the cube. Talking to visitors and relishing the opportunity to show off their skills. The next Art workshop starts on February 2nd.

Our Next Artist in Residence: Dr Tracie Mitchell

The Thread of an Idea: February 5 – March 6.

Arts residencies are significant moments for makers as it gives them permission to sit with an idea, or to remember the importance of playing and exploring without the pressure of set piece of work or a preconceptual idea.

The February ArtCube art residency is an opportunity for me to build on an idea that was coming into fruition at the Venus Bay Community Centre Art Cube Project. I was looking specifically at a free form hand stitching – a method of stitching free from any set patterning such as embroidery stitching or following a marked out pattern. I see it as a subconscious type of hand stitching – an abstract process that will reveal an outcome rather than an outcome being decided before the process has already started.

An outcome of the previous residency has been the inspiration to apply to be part of a new arts project in East Gippsland. NIGHT FROCKS @ ICEWORKS is an initiative of the FLOAT creative venture. I have been invited to embellish a vintage French linen nightgown which will become part of an exhibition in Lakes Entrance as part of the Winter festival running 19th June through to July 19th 2026.

My time in the Artcube will be researching the history of the fabrics and exploring the sensory connections made as a result of a slow sew intention.

Final Call - limited time in to fill in the ArtCube we have only 3 weeks available in March.

If you have been thinking about whether to apply NOW is the time to do it!

Whether you're a visual artist, installation artist, performer, or experimental maker, the ArtCube offers a **unique opportunity** to engage the community, test new ideas, or set aside time in a dedicated space to explore your own art practice.

Why be involved?

Creative Incubation

- The ArtCube is a seasonal incubator for creativity — a place where bold ideas and experimental works are welcomed.
- It's perfect for short residencies, pop-up exhibitions, participatory projects, or creative happenings.
- Artists are encouraged to use the space to push boundaries, try something new, and connect directly with the public.

We're seeking **expressions of interest** from individual artists or collectives interested in occupying the Blue Cube; projects may be as short as a weekend or run over several weeks. This can be a simple outline of what you are thinking about. All disciplines welcome!

The Bald Hills Wind Farm Community Fund is inviting community organisations in the Tarwin Lower, Walkerville and Venus Bay district to submit applications for its 2026 Community Grants program.

Applications are now open and will **CLOSE on FRIDAY, 10 February 2026**. Application forms and information can be found on the BHWF website – [Community Fund](#), but here it is in a nutshell:

2026 Grant

This year, the Community Fund has \$27,000.00 available for grants to community organisations. The Bald Hills Wind Farm Community Fund Committee has decided that for the 2026 financial year it will provide two categories of grants:

1. **DISTRICT PROJECT GRANT:** One grant of up to \$15,000 will be awarded to an organisation undertaking a District Project. District Projects must demonstrate community partnerships/collaboration and overall benefit to the district/wider community.
2. **SMALL PROJECT GRANTS:** One Small Project will be awarded up to the amount of \$5,000. The remainder of the funds will be allocated to small grants of up to \$2,000. Small Project grants are for the organisation to enable it to provide a benefit or service to the local community.

THE GREAT PIPI DEBATE

It seems it's back on the table again – the perennial pipi issue!

There is no doubt there were lots of visitors to Venus Bay this summer. Of course, our infrastructure was never created for so many people at one time – and some of the disquiet relates to parking (some very bad and thoughtless parking was observed) and of course the additional rubbish that people bring and leave.

Over many years, there has been work done behind the scenes to acknowledge, address and try to deal with some of the issues.

As a marine coastal park – managed by Parks Victoria – the

policy is to have no bins. In a concession to the park/township boundaries, bins are located at beach 1 and emptied each day by the Shire. The Community Centre created the Free Summer Beach shuttle to reduced parking congestion at Beach 1 – and to allow emergency vehicle access to the beach. Reduced catch limit for pipi's was instituted; despite being under-resourced Fisheries officers continue to monitor limits and licences. A significant 3 year study was undertaken by University of Melbourne's Dr John Morrongiello into the sustainability of pipi harvesting. The Great Pipi Research Study

In December 2016, Dr John Morrongiello, from the University of Melbourne and his team started the much anticipated sustainability project: Assessing the sustainability of Venus Bay's recreational and commercial pipi harvest

This was a 3 year study of the Venus Bay pipi population and was funded by Recreational Fishing Licence Grants Program.

The study sampled a number of locations along 15km of the beach, from the top of Point Smythe to 8km south of Beach 1. At each location, they sampled the pipi population and measured the size of all individuals we catch. They also measured the beach profile using surveying equipment to quantify local habitat variation. Using this data, in conjunction with tide, season and geographic information to model the drivers of pipi abundance on the beach. This information allows assessment of the relative importance of recreational and commercial harvesting and natural environmental variability on driving demographic patterns in the population.

While this study was complete nearly 2 years ago – it has taken some time going through official channels, but now it is available.

While issues relating to the sustainability of pipi harvesting are still ongoing, this study provides accurate data to inform future policy positions and provides a platform of scientific research for future advocacy
