COMMUNITY RESILIENCE IN ACTION

It was great to see the resilience of our community in Venus Bay & Tarwin Lower in action during the recent storm event that caused devastation across Gippsland along with widespread power outages.



The Venus Bay Community Centre sprang into action – offering community members a place to be during the uncertain and frightening outage. The establishment of a stand-alone microgrid at the Centre meant that there was power, water, toilets, and the comfort of having somewhere to be together.

This kind of event is exactly why we created the Microgrid – and continue to work on Community Resilience and reliable energy with our Community Energy Project. It was great to see that it all worked – and was much appreciated by community members.

Over 80 people spent time together either charging devices, putting food in our fridge or freezer, seeking

information or sharing a rather delicious luncheon. People brought in extra power boards, extra food; people sprang into action in the kitchen helping to prepare food, making cups of tea and talking with each other and helping wherever was needed.

Many people commented that it was comforting to be able to be with others, to share the limited information that was accessible and to be safe- and they felt connected to the community.

While we were able to provide power – the event highlighted the frustrations and fears around the inability to seek information on-line. Being able to find out what was happening – how long the power would be out- is there any petrol stations in operation – how can I contact family – amongst many concerns were raised.





We were thrilled that CFA Captain Mick Moore and CERT team member Lou joined us, it was unsettling to know that even emergency services had limited communications – and for a time ooo was not working. While ABC and local radio provided some information (if you had a battery radio), mostly people were directed to keep checking Vic Emergency App, or other websites –

which of course don't work without Internet or communications.



Over many years we have been advocating Telstra and NBN to provide more battery back up to ensure communications can continue – with little success. With such reliance on internet and mobile towers for even basic communications – including land-line phones, this is an essential service.

Perhaps this widespread event that caused such devastation and trauma to Gippsland communities might be the trigger to act, if we all work together.



It's happening at last!!

Thanks to everyone for your patience as we work through planning and scheduling, business case development, stakeholder relations and community input and design to actually start using SUNNY for scheduled services for our community!

We are starting with a trial schedule of services – this is based on what we have learned from community feedback, conversations, surveys and local knowledge of our community.

We know there will be some challenges as we start – coordinating bookings, driver rosters, communicating the schedule and assisting people to understand what this project is – and what it is not.

We have heard that

- people are keen to get around the townships of Venus Bay (all estates), Tarwin Lower and Walkerville -for all sorts of reasons including shopping, post office, social catch ups and more.
- many people are keen to connect to V-Line Services either in Leongatha or Wonthaggi.
- people want to have the opportunity for shopping/outings/appointments/movies in both Leongatha and Wonthaggi.
- people are interested in using the bus for group bookings to attend events/festivals/markets etc.

Hence, we have created a range of options in the first instance to trial meeting these requests in this community transport pilot project.

We have created a <u>Frequently Asked Questions</u> sheet – which we will add to as more information or queries emerge.

La Trobe University has developed an online <u>BOOKING LINK</u> – to help people connect with the service. We encourage people to use this to assist with driver schedules, pick up/drop offs and to see if it works (!). We know not everyone will use this, so we offer a phone message services as well – so we can help people navigate the booking process.

OUR PLAN – is to trial this schedule for 3 months, reviewing after 1 month to see if it is being used, and then tweaking, based on community and driver feedback. This means we will load the schedule on our website – so it can be changed as needed and is current at all times.

A massive thank you to everyone who has registered as a volunteer driver so far – this project will depend on volunteers to succeed. And thank you to those who have offered to assist in other ways – we are still working on creating a working group to assist us to navigate the range of duties/planning/communicating/assessing and operating this service.

We welcome all involvement in the project and would appreciate any feedback, especially during this trial period.

We acknowledge there will be teething issues – please reach out to either Alyson or Bill to discuss – we'll do our best to assist. We also acknowledge the Men's Shed Bus About Town – which travels each fortnight to Wonthaggi for shopping – we have deliberately avoided scheduling services that conflict with that – we want to see all transport options flourish in our district.

For the first month – the trial service will be free (although we are happy to accept donations in support of the service). Group booking will attract a fee (likely to be \$100) and will be dependent on availability and volunteer drivers.

Once we have ironed out initial issues, we will establish a Friends of Sunny fund – for those that want to see this project succeed but may not use the service. Additionally, there will be a nominal fee for scheduled services.

PLEASE BE PATIENT (AND KIND) – help us to make this work for the community...by the community!

SUNNY will be undertaking a few engagement duties for the first week of March as we head towards the start the first trial of scheduled service on Wednesday 13 March.





Did you know that your recycling - through the Container Deposit Scheme - can help the Venus Bay Community Centre?

We are registered with <u>CDS VIC EAST APP</u> – that means no matter where you might be depositing your containers, you can chose Venus Bay Community Centre as your recipient. Here's how:



March 18th is Global Recycling Day

Take a minute out of your day to consider ways you can contribute to the recycling process.

- Recycling one plastic bottle saves enough energy to turn on a 6o-watt lightbulb for three hours.
- 2. Recycling one aluminum can saves enough energy to run the TV for three hours.
- 3. It can take as fast as 30 days for a glass container in recycling bin to be on a shop shelve again.
- 4. The average person generates about 1.9 kg of trash every single day. So think twice before you throw please!
- 5. Glass and aluminium can be recycled endlessly without losing its quality and purity.
- 6. The first recorded instance of recycling is paper recycling in Japan in 1031.
- 7. With 5 recycled plastic bottles we can make one XL T-shirt, 27 bottles a sweater, 35 we can make a sleeping bag!
- 8. Since a charge was introduced for using a plastic bag, plastic bag use has dropped by 80%.
- 9. We save 17 trees when a ton of paper is recycled.
- 10. Every week nearly 90% of newspaper are thrown away, that equals to throwing half a million trees into landfill. Shall we subscribe online newspaper instead?







Our Native Plant Group have been working hard propagating indigenous plants in the lead up to Autumn and our Koala Food Project at Easter.


There's a great range of grasses, shrubs and trees available – and we know our indigenous plants survive the best in our gardens – plus- they are wonderful food for our native animals!






Plant sales contribute to the costs of the Native Plant Group — who meet every Monday morning from 10am to 12 noon at the Centre.

About the review

If a council is subdivided into wards, the number of voters in each ward should be within +/-10% of the average across all wards to comply with the *Local Government Act 2020* (Vic).

Changes to the population, location of housing areas, and voting entitlements all impact the number of voters in wards.

In accordance with section 17 of the Act, the Minister for Local Government has asked the Victorian Electoral Commission (VEC) to review the ward boundaries for South Gippsland Shire Council.


Adjusting ward boundaries aims to ensure voters are represented equally at the next council general election.


During its review, the VEC will look at South Gippsland Shire Council's:
